COMPOSITION OF COMPETITION GROUPS

The following teams will be taking part in this Championship: 25 boys teams and 16 girls teams:

BOYS: Austria, Belgium Flanders, Belgium French Community, Brazil, Bulgaria, China, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iran, Israel, Italy, Luxembourg, Poland, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, South Africa, Sweden, Turkey 1 and Turkey 2.

GIRLS: Belgium, Brazil, China, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Israel, Italy, Poland, Puerto Rico, Sweden, Turkey 1 and Turkey 2.

The draw took place on 3 February 2009 in Istanbul in the presence of Andrea Delpin, the ISF Delegate and of Hasan Ceylan, the President of the ISF Technical Commission for Football.

1. PARTICIPATION AND COMPOSITION OF TEAMS

1.1 Only school teams may participate. Each country may enter only one school boys' team (all players must be enrolled at the same school) and one school girls' team (all players must be enrolled at the same school).

1.2 Each team shall be composed of 18 players, 2 teachers and 1 referee.
If a team has at accreditation less than 18 players, no other person may subsequently take the unallocated place(s).

Each delegation shall nominate a Head of Delegation who shall be the official representative for the all the teams in his/her delegation. He/she may not combine the functions of head of delegation and coach.

He/she shall be the sole intermediary between his/her delegation and the OC, the TC and the ISF Delegate.

Each country, which enters teams must provide one referee per team. All referees shall be in possession of a national (highest level) or international qualification. Their status is to be certified by a document or licence authenticated by the national Football federation.

A full delegation consists of 22 persons (where 1 team is entered) or 43 persons (where 2 teams are entered).

1.3 Players must be enrolled as full-time students in the country, which they represent and must have been born in 1992, 1993 or 1994. Neither older, nor younger players will be accepted!

1.4 Each participating country has the right to include a maximum of 2 additional adults whose function must be specified: doctor, physiotherapist, interpreter, security personnel, ministerial representative, journalist, etc... .

Any additional persons will not be considered part of the official delegation and will not be accredited by the OC.

1.5 If the delegation travels by bus, the driver of the bus will be considered as a member of the delegation.

1.6 Each participating team must be nominated officially by the school sport authority in the ISF member country.

2. INTERNATIONAL GET-TOGETHER "NIGHT OF THE NATIONS"

2.1 Delegations are required to take part in an evening "**International Get-together**" organised with the aim of encouraging exchanges between the different cultures of participating countries. The young people are invited to introduce and to promote their countries and their culture in an original fashion. Each delegation is to organise a stand at the "Tourist Fair" on the theme "Suppose you came to spend your holidays in my country?" This presentation may be made in the form of leaflets, video, CD, photos or other original ideas, for example by offering a taste of typical culinary specialities (dishes, drinks). On addition each delegation may, if it wishes, introduce a facet of its country's culture on stage (the stage is yours – dances, songs, sketches...) maximum 4 minutes.

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 Each day's results along with important information from the OC will be published in the daily bulletin.
In addition the ISF internet site and the organisers' internet site will be updated regularly.

4. DATES

- 4.1 Delegations will arrive on 5 April 2009.
- 4.2 Delegations will depart after breakfast on 13 April 2009.
- 4.3 When the distance between Antalya and the capital of a participating country on another continent exceeds 5000 kilometres the delegation may extend their stay by arriving one day earlier **or** leaving one day later.
- 4.4 The organisation of an extended stay for the delegation (before or after the event) is a matter for the country concerned. It shall not be the responsibility of the Organising Committee. The organisers will be able to give you information on alternative accommodation in the area for your use outside the period of the Championship and for those accompanying the delegation.

6. TRANSPORT

- 6.1 Travel as far as Antalya international airport is to be arranged and financed by each participating country.
- 6.2 The organisers will finance and be responsible for transfer of delegations between Antalya international airport and their accommodation on arrival and departure and similarly all transport in connection with the official programme (arrival, departure, sports and cultural programmes)

7. BOARD, LODGING AND SERVICES

- 7.1 All the players and coaches will be accommodated in the five-star Hotel Arkadia in Antalya, players in 2 to 4-bedded rooms and coaches in twin-bedded rooms.

Heads of delegation, referees and ISF representatives will be accommodated in Atlantis Hotel.

- 7.2 Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be served in the accommodation.
- 7.3 The competition will take place within 15 minutes drive of the hotel.
- 7.4 Currency may be exchanged everywhere, however it is advisable to do this before departure. The exchange rate as of 01 March 2009 is 1 EUR = 2.15 TL.
- 7.5 A medical service will be available throughout the duration of the championship.
- 7.6 A (paying) laundry service is to be found in the hotels.
- 7.7 A connection to the Internet will be available in the hotels.

8. FINANCE AND INSURANCE

- 8.1 The fees payable per person and per night amount to 42 EUR in accordance with current ISF regulations. The amount due per person is 336 EUR, less the amount of the deposit previously paid.
- 8.2 The balance of the sum due may be paid in EUR to the ORGANISERS' BANK ACCOUNT by 15 March 2009 at the latest.

All bank charges are the responsibility of the delegations!

The Head of Delegation on arrival in Antalya shall pay the balance of the sum due in cash. Payment by bank cards and/or credit cards will not be accepted.

- 8.3 Each member of a delegation must pay an ISF levy of 25 EUR in accordance with current ISF regulations. This sum is to be paid to the Organising Committee before the start of the championship (ISF GCR 7.11).
- 8.4 Each participating country may include in its delegation a maximum of 2 additional persons. For these persons the charges are 84 EUR each in a single room, 42 EUR each for 2 additional persons sharing a double or twin-bedded room and 42 EUR for an additional person who shares a room with another adult member of the delegation (coach or referee). The country concerned should make such request.
- 8.5 If the delegation travels by bus, the driver of the bus will not be considered as an additional person and will be charged 42 EUR per night.
- 8.6 When the distance between Antalya and the capital of a participating country on another continent exceeds 5000 kilometres the delegation may extend their stay by arriving one day earlier **or** leaving one day later.
- 8.7 Delegations, which are unable to provide the required number of national or international referees, will be required to pay a fine of 907 EUR per missing referee. Referees must present their national/international referee's licences for inspection.
- 8.8 Each country is required to provide insurance for each member of its delegation. At a minimum the insurance is to cover civil liability material damage and medical costs.

9. ENTRIES

- 9.1 The forms, duly completed and signed by the organisation responsible for school sport must reach the organiser at the latest by 15 March 2009.
- 9.2 It is an essential requirement that you give the organiser all the information requested in the bulletin.
You must send a named identity photograph of each member of the delegation if possible by e-mail (in .jpg format) or by post by 15 March 2009.

10. TECHNICAL INFORMATION

10.1 All matches will be played according to International Football Federation (FIFA) rules.

10.2 SHOOT OUT

After the group matches, in the event of a game finishing on equal scores, instead of penalty kicks the following procedure (shoot out) will apply:

1- the players remaining on the field of play will go to the centre circle.

The referee will decide which goal will be used and will toss a coin for the choice of who goes first. The winner has the choice.

2- both goalkeepers go to the goal, with the defending goalkeeper taking up a position on the goal line and the attacking goalkeeper standing behind the assistant referee in the field of play.

3- the first assistant stays in the centre circle and controls that area.
The referee takes up a suitable position between the centre circle and the penalty area.

4- the ball is placed on the edge of the centre circle. The first assistant blows a whistle and the attacker has 15 second to dribble the ball and shoot for goal. The first assistant will be responsible for timing and will blow a whistle when the 15 seconds is up.

5- the normal laws of the game apply to the attacker and goalkeeper.
The goalkeeper may come outside the penalty area but cannot handle the ball. A foul by the goalkeeper will result in yellow card and the game will be restarted by the same attacker getting a second opportunity to score from the centre circle.

6- if the teams are still level after five attempts sudden death will apply.

10.3 The official competition ball will be a Nike.
The OC will make 6 balls available to each team for training and warm-up.

10.4 The duration of all matches will be 2 times 30 minutes. Only the final for boys (1st and 2nd place) will last 2 times 40 minutes.

11. PRIZE-GIVING

11.1 Each player will receive a commemorative certificate.

11.2 The teams finishing first, second and third will be rewarded with medals and trophies.

11.3 The ISF Fair Play Trophy will be awarded to a delegation by the Disciplinary Commission following consultation with the ISF TC, the delegations and the Organising Committee.

12. CONTROL COMMISSION

12.1 In accordance with General Competition Rules the Organising Committee will designate a Control Commission composed of:

- 1) 4 representatives of the ISF Football Technical Commission
- 2) 1 representative of the Organising Committee

12.2 At accreditation, the head of delegation must settle with the organisers the balance to be paid including any bank charges and will present the following documents to the Control Commission:

- 1) Proof of payment of the balance including any bank charges.
- 2) The passport (or identity card) of every player bearing surname, forename, photograph, nationality and date of birth.
- 3) A letter from the school confirming that all players are full time students at the school.
- 4) 1 photograph of each member of the official delegation if these were not submitted at the time requested.

When checking is complete, each participant will receive a photographic identity card, which will allow him/her access to the competitions, activities and meals.

12.3 The Control Commission will fulfil all the obligations stated in the ISF General Competition Rules.

13. DISCIPLINARY COMMISSION

13.1 In accordance with the ISF General Competition Rules, the Disciplinary Commission will be composed of:

- 1) the delegate representing the ISF Executive Committee.
- 2) the President of the ISF Technical Commission for Football.
- 3) the President of the Organising Committee.

13.2 The Disciplinary Commission will deal with all matters relating to discipline arising during Championship matches and also during the period of the Championships where the matters are not covered by technical regulations.

13.3 The Disciplinary Commission's decisions are final and may not be appealed. They are passed on to the Executive Committee.

13.4 It should be noted that where there is a sufficiently serious lack of respect for ISF rules the Disciplinary Commission has the right to disqualify players, teams or delegations from the competition and to require them to return home before the conclusion of the event.

14. APPEAL JURY

14.1 In accordance with ISF General Competition Rules, the Appeal Jury will be composed of:

- 1) a representative of the ISF Technical Commission for Football.
- 2) a representative of the Organising Committee.
- 3) a representative of the referees.

14.2 The Appeal Jury will decide on all appeals concerning the results of games and matches in the light of the rules Football as published by the FIFA and listed in the manual of the ISF Technical Commission for Football.

14.3 The Appeal Jury will not pronounce on disciplinary matters.

14.4 Appeal Jury decisions are final and may not be appealed.

15. APPEALS

15.1 Appeals against results or any other appeal not concerning disciplinary matters will be heard by the Appeal Jury.

15.2 The appeal must be lodged within 120 minutes of the incident and be in writing in English, French or German.

15.3 The sum of 50 EUR must accompany the appeal. This sum will be refunded only if the appeal is upheld or at the discretion of the Jury of Appeals.

16. OBLIGATIONS UNDERTAKEN BY DELEGATIONS

- 16.1 Each participant is required to be present throughout the duration of the event.
- 16.2 Each participant is obliged to take part in all of the non-sport activities.
- 16.3 Each team undertakes to compete against all other participating teams.
- 16.4 Each participant undertakes to play against all other participants.
- 16.5 The absence of any member of a participating team from any part of the entire sport programme, opening-, prize giving- and closing ceremonies and socio-cultural programme will result in the disqualification of that team.

17. DOPING

Dope testing (for use of banned substances) will take place during the competition according to current law/procedures in Turkey.

If selected for testing a competitor may be accompanied by an adult. If a competitor is following a course of medical treatment he or she must obtain certification to that effect and inform the organisers immediately upon arrival.

18. CLIMATE
