### **ABOUT ISF FUTSAL**





#### INTRODUCTION

ISF World Schools Championships (WSC) are events characterized by a balanced programme between sport and educational content: the balance between sport and education is to create awareness about the role of sports in putting forward topics such as fair play, healthy lifestyle, respect, and inclusion.

WSC is open to the participation of school teams. Besides the name of the respective member, teams will defend the colors and name of the specific school they represent. This format is meant to create a strong identification between the students and the school they attend. WSC is a team competition, meaning that team results are awarded by trophies, medals, and certificates.

Each ISF member may enter the competition with more than one school team per category. School Sport Entities or Schools from School Sport Entities that are not members of the ISF can take a part in ISF events provided that they follow all ISF regulations and that the institutions that wish to enter the event are recognized by an official national or sport authority.

Age categories for WSC's are outlined in their respective sport-specific rules. The educational programme and the sport format of the event shall always be adapted to the age of participants: in general, in events for lower age categories, the educational content will have a more prominent role.

### ABOUT ISF ACADEMY







Created in December 2022, the ISF Academy is the new educational center of the International School Sport Federation delivering online and onsite capacity-building activities for teachers, school sports representatives, coaches, officials, and students around the world. It aims to recognize and or to upgrade the knowledge and skills of any of these stakeholders involved or planning to be involved in national, continental, or international sports, educational networks, institutions, events, or organisation.

The mission of this body is to design and deliver short-, mid-, and long-term quality education and capacity-building activities for physical education teachers, national school sport representatives, coaches, officials, and students around the world. These educational programmes will be held online on the ISF Academy platform prior to the events and particularly during the organisation of ISF events on-site, after the competition hours.

Therefore, before and during this international ISF event, heads of delegation, coaches, referees, international school athletes, and local school students will have the opportunity to take part in various interactive educational activities on different topics



## HEAD OF DELEGATION AND COACHES PROGRAMME







The ISF Academy will organise an online webinar, a few weeks before the event to support the Head of Delegation and Coaches in preparing their mission within an ISF event. These online educational & capacity building activities are compulsory to attend for all the following adults' stakeholders taking part in ISF events:

- 1) Heads of Delegation (Compulsory)
- 2) Deputy Head of Delegation (if any and if the delegation request it)
- 3) Assistant to the Head of Delegation (if any and if the delegation request it)
- 4) Coaches (Compulsory)

The programme will be composed of different modules related to the ISF, the Organising Committee, and several crucial subjects related to Safeguarding in Sports, Anti-Doping, and Diplomacy in Sport. Other topics might be added as well.

Any adults having key responsibilities towards, the ISF, the Local Organising Committee, and ultimately school students within an ISF international event shall be taking part in this crucial educational programme which will contribute to supporting these adults in their duty and mission before, during, and after the event.

Important: The head of the delegation and the coaches will have to participate in the complete training programme to be authorized to receive accreditation for the event.



Note: Webinar is a subject to a fee depending on the role of the participant. Special Bulletin for this event will be publish 3 month before the competition.

## EDUCATION ACTIVITIES DURING EVENT

## ISF YOUNG REPORTERS PROGRAMME







The ISF Young Reporters Programme
It is an educational programme offering media education with
experts while providing practice in the field on the
international stage. This programme welcomes participants

from all around the world with no prior experience needed.

The registration is open to any young people:

- Young people ISF members & non-ISF members aiming to participate exclusively in this programme
- Young reporters already part of the participating delegation to the ISF event
- Local students for the organizing committee country.
- Athletes participating in the ISF event (depending on their competition schedules)
- Any young individual could register for this programme

Young participants will be part of the School Sports Journalism and Media workshops during ISF events led by known experts offering them education, practice, and lifetime experience in the field.

They will learn about the organisation of large sporting events, photography skills, creating content for social media, what is school sports journalism, and how to report events.

Moreover, they will discover the world of video production and how broadcasting looks backstage.

## Knez Mihajlova

Pedestrian zone and commercial center - Knez Mihailova Street is protected by law since it is one of the oldest and most important monumental urban environments. Knez Mihailova is composed of multiple buildings and representative houses constructed at the end of the 1870s.

## Temple of St. Sava

It does not matter whether you are an atheist, Catholic, Muslim, Orthodox or belong to another religious group — the Temple of Saint Sava is the symbol of Belgrade and the country. Several religious sites stand out from the rest in spite of strictly defined rules that architects must be met. Unusual proportions and artistic processing, such buildings are beyond religious role and become monuments of great cultural significance.

### Zemun

Once a separate town, Zemun has been a municipality within the city of Belgrade since 1945. People have settled the area of Zemun as far back as the Neolithic, using the favourable position of the banks of the Danube and the Sava. The Zemun Fortress is the oldest building in Zemun, mentioned as early as the 9th century. The current remains are from the 15th century.

#### **TRAVELING**

Travel to the official ports of entry is to be arranged and financed by each participating delegation.

Delegations are to arrive on 7 or 8 October 2023 and depart on 17 October 2023 after breakfast. Organizing an extended stay for the delegation (before or after the event) is a matter of the concerned delegation. It shall not be the responsibility of the Local Organising Committee.

#### **VISA**

#### **EACH DELEGATION SHALL CONSISTS OF:**

- 1. Head of the delegation mandatory;
- 2. Athlete(s) mandatory;
- 3. Team official(s)
- a) Coaches mandatory b) Other team officials optional 4. Referees mandatory;
- 5.Additional adults optional;

#### **HEAD OF DELEGATION**

There is a mandatory number of one (1) head of delegation per registering delegation.

- HoD shall be the main intermediary between the delegation and the Local Organising Committee, the ISF Technical Commission, and the ISF Delegate.
- They may not combine their role of HoD with that of a coach or any other official role.
- Each delegation is entitled to enter 1 HoD.

#### STUDENT-ATHLETES

- Athletes must be students attending schools that provide general education.
- Athletes must be enrolled as full-time students at a school in the country that they represent.

All student-athletes must be attending schools that provide general education.

The following are not eligible to participate:

- Attendees of vocational schools only attend a school as a complement to their vocational training and are not full-time students with a segment of general education
- Students enrolled at schools that provide sports training without any general education
- Part-time (e.g. afternoon) sports schools take pupils from a variety of schools for training in one or more sports
- Teams formed as part of clubs, companies, or other institutions.

## TEAM OFFICIALS (COACHES AND OTHER TEAM OFFICIALS) COACHES

- The presence of a coach is mandatory.
- Teams cannot participate in the competition without the presence of a coach.
- Each team is entitled to enter a minimum of one (1) and a maximum of two (2) coaches





#### **OTHER TEAM OFFICIALS**

- The function of other team officials can be doctors, trainers, physiotherapists, statisticians, team managers etc.
- The presence of the other team officials is not mandatory.
- The function of the other team officials must be specified during the registration process.
- Any person not specified during registration or exceeding the limit will not be considered part of the team.
- Each team is entitled to enter up to two (2) other team officials.

#### Additional adults

The function of each additional adult must be specified during the registration process (interpreter, security personnel, ministry representative, media, etc.). Delegations can register up to 4 additional adults.

#### **FIELD OF PLAY OFFICIALS - REFEREES**

- Each team shall enter one (1) field of play official (referee)
- The Field of play officials cannot combine their position with other positions, such as heads of delegation, team officials, or additional adults
- Field of play officials (referees) must accept the possibility they might be in the referee or assistant referee position at the event matches
- Field of play officials (referees) shall be in possession of international (FIFA) or national qualification depending on the event type. The level of qualification shall be described in the event bulletins
- The qualification will be reviewed and approved by the ISF Futsal technical commission.
   Delegations must provide certificates for the field of play officials during the registration process
- Failure to provide the required number of field of play officials (referees) will lead to a fine of 900€ (per referee) payable to the organiser prior to the competitions

#### **ADDITIONAL ADULTS**

The presence of additional adults is not mandatory.

Delegations can register up to two (2) additional adults per one (1) or two (2) teams entered, and up to four (4) additional adults per three (3) or four (4) teams entered

The function of each additional adult must be specified during the registration process.

 Any other additional persons not specified during registration or exceeding the limit set in this document will not be considered part of the official delegation and will not be accredited by the LOC.

Any other person not specified during registration or exceeding the quotas specified in this document will not be considered part of the official delegation and will not be accredited by the LOC.

## **TECHICAL RULES**



The competition will be run according to current ISF and FIFA rules under the direction of the ISF Technical Commission for Futsal.

# DISCIPLINARY MANAGEMENT



#### **EVENT DISCIPLINARY COMMISSION**

In accordance with the ISF General Competition Rules, The ISF Event Disciplinary Commission shall deal with all incidents and all violations of the ISF Statutes, Sport Policy, ISF Handbook, Rules, and any other ISF document linked to the ISF events and broadly with misbehavior not directly related to the sport technical regulation during an ISF event.

The Event Disciplinary Commission is composed of the ISF Delegate, the TC Futsal President, and the LOC President.

#### **APPEAL JURY**

The Appeal Jury shall deal with all protests of a technical sporting nature during the competition.

The Appeal Jury is composed of the President of the Technical Commission, one member of the Local Organising Committee, and the Head Field of Play Officials.

#### **APPEALS**

Please refer to the Appeal section of the ISF Technical Rules and Regulations for the appeal of Futsal

#### **PARTICIPANTS OBLIGATIONS**

- Each participant is required to be present throughout the whole duration of the event.
- Each participant is obliged to take part in all the non-sport activities.
- Each team undertakes to compete against all other participating teams.
- The absence of a team, (or any member of a participating team member) from any part of the entire sport, opening, prize-giving and closing ceremonies and socio-cultural programme may result in the team's being excluded exclusion from the final results.

# DISCIPLINARY MANAGEMENT





#### **ANTI-DOPING**

ISF being a Wada code signatory is promoting clean sport as one of the main values applied during its events. Besides the tests that can take place accordingly to the

age category and the tradition of relevant sports, ISF in cooperation with WADA is implementing a large educational programme to raise awareness of the danger of doping behaviors.

#### **HOW TO REGISTER**

The only registrations accepted are the ones made through ERAS - the ISF registration platform.

- Each ISF member country is entitled to have the credential to access ERAS.

The registration process for ISF members is divided into 2 phases:

Phase 1 / deposit payment January 31 - May 31, 2023

Registration phase 1 for the Event shall be from January 31 to May 30, 2023. During registration phase 1 registering delegations shall indicate their intention of participating, the number of teams per category that they wish to enter, and the exact number of participants per team. All ISF members are expected to pay the deposits for their teams or reach an agreement with the ISF (see chapter below) by May 30, 20232. The delegation will be able to enter Registration phase 2 after the \*deposit has been paid or an agreement with the ISF has been reached but no later than 10th December.

#### Phase 2

#### June 1 - August 31, 2023

In registration phase 2, countries are expected to enter the exact detailed information for each participant (name, date of birth, gender, photo, dietary requirements). Furthermore, the delegation will submit their expected date of arrival and departure as well as the type of transport that will be required.

## FINANCIAL CONDITIONS





Please note that this section of this bulletin is relevant only to ISF members.

To participate, each ISF member is required to make two (2) payments:

- 1. Deposit payment
- 2. Balance fee payment
- 1. Deposit payment



Along with the entry and in order to have access to registration phase 2, participating in ISF members will need to pay a deposit of 1300€ per team registered in Phase 1.

Please note that participation in the event is granted only by a deposit payment. Deadline of deposit payment: May 31, 2023

- The sum will be deducted from the total participation cost.
- The deposit must be sent as a single payment for the whole delegation by the organisation responsible for school sports (federation, trust, ministry...).
- The deposit is non-refundable in the event of non-participation. Waivers to the payment of the deposit, for whatever reasons, are to be discussed with the ISF office and to be
  - agreed upon before the deposit payment deadlines.

The deposit for the registered teams per category shall be paid by May 31, 2023.

If the deposit is not paid within the given deadline, the registrations will not be considered valid and will be automatically deleted from ERAS.

#### 2. Balance fee payment



The balance fee payment is the participation fee minus the deposit which has already been paid.

The balance fee payment is to be paid before the start of the event to the LOC account (all bank charges are to be met by the participating country).

#### Participation fee

The participation fee covers full board accommodation for the duration of the event plus competition, cultural programme activities, and all local transport from the arrival to the official port of entry to the departure of the team.
