
INTRODUCTION

The ISF U15 GYMNASIADE (World School Sports Games) was organised for the first time in ISF history in 2021 in Belgrade (Serbia). It brought together 1.849 school athletes from 36 countries aged 13 to 15 in a multi-sport event (14 different sports), creating a unique context for high-level sports competitions, educational programmes, and cultural exchanges. The educational programme and the sports format of the event shall always be adapted to the age of the participants. This second edition of the U15 Gymnasiade, will see the world of school sport travel to Rio de Janeiro, where school sport athletes will be competing in 22 sports, including 3 para sports, from the 19th - 27th August 2023.

Sports competition: The best student-athletes in the world will participate in the ISF U15 Gymnasiade as an individual and as part of teams. In addition to the name of the respective member, individuals and individuals as part of the teams will represent their school. This format is meant to create a strong identification between the students and the school they attend.

The Educational programme: Programmes to develop leadership skills (healthy lifestyle, Olympic values, SDG UN 2020..), to raise awareness on the main policies and challenges in sport (Gender equality, Fair-Play, ...). Seminars and workshops are organised with the ISF sport and institutional partners.

Cultural exchanges: A cultural programme will be organised each day for the participants during which they will have the opportunity to visit and experience the culture and heritage of Rio de Janeiro and Brazil. The participating countries will have the opportunity to present their culture and traditional values through different types of cultural/entertainment activities and create cross-cultural exchanges by discovering the culture of the other participants and the host country.

We have experience and ability to organize large-scale events. In 2022, we will have the South American School Games in Brazil and, in August 2023, the U-15 Gymnasiade (World School Games). Two competitions that reflect our idea of contributing to the integral formation of our children and young people. School sports are a fundamental tool in this process.

Therefore, our investment priority is in the sports base, inverting the pyramid of investment. The rescue of the Brazilian School Games (JEB's), after a hiatus of 17 years without the event, is proof of that. ABOUT ISF ACADEMY





Created in December 2022, the ISF Academy is the new educational center of the International School Sport Federation delivering online and onsite capacity-building activities for teachers, school sports representatives, coaches, officials, and students around the world. It aims to recognize and or to upgrade the knowledge and skills of any of these stakeholders involved or planning to be involved in national, continental, or international sports, educational networks, institutions, events, or organisation.

The mission of this body is to design and deliver short-, mid-, and long-term quality education and capacity-building activities for physical education teachers, national school sport representatives, coaches, officials, and students around the world. These educational programmes will be held online on the ISF Academy platform prior to the events and particularly during the organisation of ISF events on-site, after the competition hours.

Therefore, before and during this international ISF event, heads of delegation, coaches, referees, international school athletes, and local school students will have the opportunity to take part in various interactive educational activities on different topics



HEAD OF DELEGATION AND COACHES PROGRAMME





The ISF Academy will organise an online webinar, a few weeks before the event to support the Head of Delegation and Coaches in preparing their mission within an ISF event. These online educational & capacity building activities are compulsory to attend for all the following adults' stakeholders taking part in ISF events:

- 1) Heads of Delegation (Compulsory)
- 2) Deputy Head of Delegation (if any and if the delegation request it)
- 3) Assistant to the Head of Delegation (if any and if the delegation request it)
- 4) Coaches (Compulsory)

The programme will be composed of different modules related to the ISF, the Organising Committee, and several crucial subjects related to Safeguarding in Sports, Anti-Doping, and Diplomacy in Sport. Other topics might be added as well.

Any adults having key responsibilities towards, the ISF, the Local Organising Committee, and ultimately school students within an ISF international event shall be taking part in this crucial educational programme which will contribute to supporting these adults in their duty and mission before, during, and after the event.

Important: The head of the delegation and the coaches will have to participate in the complete training programme to be authorized to receive accreditation for the event.



Note: Webinar is a subject to a fee depending on the role of the participant. Special Bulletin for this event will be published before the competition.

ISF YOUNG REPORTERS PROGRAMME







The ISF Young Reporters Programme
It is an educational programme offering media education with
experts while providing practice in the field on the
international stage. This programme welcomes participants
from all around the world with no prior experience needed.

The registration is open to any young people:

- Young people ISF members & non-ISF members aiming to participate exclusively in this programme
- Young reporters already part of the participating delegation to the ISF event
- Local students for the organizing committee country.
- Athletes participating in the ISF event (depending on their competition schedules)
- Any young individual could register for this programme

Young participants will be part of the School Sports Journalism and Media workshops during ISF events led by known experts offering them education, practice, and lifetime experience in the field.

They will learn about the organisation of large sporting events, photography skills, creating content for social media, what is school sports journalism, and how to report events.

Moreover, they will discover the world of video production and how broadcasting looks backstage.

Christ

From the top of Corcovado Mountain, in the midst of a stunning urban forest, the imposing image of the Christ the Redeemer reigns supreme. It is no coincidence that the Christ, the greatest art-deco work on the planet, is among the Seven Wonders of the Modern World. An icon of the city, it is he who, with open arms, welcomes visitors who arrive in Rio de Janeiro. There are two ways to reach the 38- meter statue that sits atop a 710-meter hill: a pleasant train ride that crosses the Atlantic Forest, departing from the neighborhood of Cosme Velho, or the accredited vans that take the Estrada das Paineiras to get there. Regardless of the way you choose to get there, the view is stunning



Sugarloaf



The cable car route that connects the Urca and Sugarloaf Mountains is one of the must-see sites in the city. A stunning landscape, including the Botafogo Cove, the Copacabana Promenade and the entrance to the Guanabara Bay, is revealed during the route. 395 meters above sea level, the Sugarloaf Mountain reveals other corners of the city, such as Pedra da Gâvea, the City Center, Copacabana beach and the Christ the Redeemer. To enjoy the tour even more, you'll find dining and entertainment options, a panoramic helicopter ride, and a large amphitheater oken used for concerts and events at Urca Hill, combining fun with the city's beautiful view.

Santa Teresa and Lapa

Two adjacent neighborhoods that preserve history in their own way. While Santa Teresa has a bucolic atmosphere, with a tram ride, its beautiful historic houses and effervescent cultural life, thanks to the numerous workshops that bring life to century-old buildings, Lapa is pure excitement. A day trip through the cit/s most bohemian neighborhood, crossed by the imposing Lapa Arches, is very different from the bustling nightlife that reveals itself in the hundreds of bars, restaurants, and concert halls.

In Santa Teresa, be sure to check out the Ruins Park, which was the home of the great patron of Rio's Belle Epoque, Laurinda Santos Lobo and has one of the most beautiful views in the neighborhood. Next to it is the Châcara do Céu Museum, inherited by Castro Maya in 1936, which exhibits art collections of diPerent styles and from different origins, furniture, and decorative arts, distributed across a beautiful 3-story house.



Maracanã

Maracana was the stage of the most important Brazilian derbies and witnessed historical moments of international soccer. Stage of the grand finals of the 1950 and 2014 World Cups, the stadium is open for visitation daily. The Soccer Museum has relics that will drive soccer lovers crazy. The museum, located on the ground floor of the stadium, has a collection of shirts, soccer boots and a Walk of Fame.

Barra da Tijuca and surroundings





Located in the West Zone, this region has important international hotel chains, modern shopping malls and commercial centers, movie theaters, in addition to great restaurants, among other attractions. Culture is also one of the attractions of this neighborhood, which homes Rio's largest cultural venue: Cidade das Artes. just around the corner you'll find the Museum of the Brazilian National Soccer Team, an interactive space that recollects the trajectory of our National Team through innovative technologies and historical items, as jerseys and original trophies. And we cannot forget to mention Barra da Tijuca, Rio's longest beach.

SPORT VENUES

The Barra Olympic Park (Brazilian
Portuguese: Parque Olímpico da Barra),
originally the City of Sports Complex, is a
cluster of nine sporting venues in Barra da
Tijuca, in the west zone of Rio de Janeiro,
Brazil. The park, which served as the Olympic
Park for the 2016 Summer Olympics and the
2016 Summer Paralympics, was originally
built for the 2007 Pan American Games,
consisting of three venues. The complex was
later expanded to nine venues for the
Olympics, two of which are temporary
structures. The complex will later become the
site of the Olympic Training Center after the
games conclude.











TRANSPORTATION

The city has a modern international airport with a vast air network, connecting Rio to Brazil and the world. Located at Ilha do Governador, the Tom jobim International Airport - Riogaleâo is about 20 minutes away from the City Center and the South Zone, where most tourist attractions are located, and has fast connection with the region of Barra da Tijuca, through an expressway, the Linha Amarela (Yellow Line).

The second largest airport in the City, and the first to be built, Santos Dumont airport is located in the City Center, in a privileged location, right by the Guanabara Bay. It concentrates domestic flights. Its main activity is the Rio - Sao Paulo air shuttle service, in addition to connecting Rio to several cities in the country.

Ports of Entry

The following are the official ports of entry:

- GIG = Galeão international airport Tom Jobim (Rio de Janeiro)
- SDU = Santos Dummont international airport (Rio de Janeiro)

Traveling

Travel to the official ports of entry is to be arranged and financed by each participating delegation.

Delegations are to arrive on August 19, 2023, and depart on August 27, 2023, after breakfast. The organization of an extended stay for the delegation (before or after the event) is a matter of the delegation concerned. It shall not be the responsibility of the Local Organising Committee. When the distance between the host city and the capital of a participating delegation on another continent exceeds 5000km, the delegation may extend its stay by arriving one day earlier (August 18, 2023) and/or leaving one day later (August 28, 2023) at the standard daily fee.

VISA

Each participating delegation is required to check whether a VISA is required to enter Brazil. Please contact the relevant Embassy or Consulate to consult the necessary VISA application procedure.

The VISA document is granted by the Consulates representing Brazil abroad enabling the admission and stay of foreigners within the territory of Brazil, provided that the conditions established by law have been met.

To apply for a VISA, foreigners must submit the following:

- VISA application form
- Valid travel document
- Proof of payment of consular fees,
- International Certificate of Immunization when necessary
- Other specific documents dependant on the type of VISA requested.

Insurance

Each participating delegation is required to provide insurance for each member of its delegation. At a minimum, the insurance is to cover civil liability, material damage, and medical costs.

Measures Related to COVID-19

With the guidance of policies put in place by the National Health Commission, the Local Organising Committee will implement the necessary regulations regarding COVID-19 to ensure it's control and prevention throughout the event.

According to the guidelines of the federal health agency – ANVISA.

Rules for those arriving by plane:

Vaccinated Travellers must present proof of vaccination.

Non-vaccinated travellers must present to the airline, before boarding, the document proving they have performed a test for Covid-19, with negative or non-detectable results, of the antigen or RT-PCR laboratory test type, performed one day before the moment of boarding.

Only specific reasons for exemption of vaccination when entering the Brazilian territory are allowed:

- Possessing Brazilian nationality
- Residing in the Brazilian territory
- Living with a health condition that contradicts vaccination (attested by a medical report)
- Not eligible for vaccination due to age
- Travelling from countries with low vaccination coverage

Foreigners who are not fully vaccinated will not be allowed entry into the Brazilian territory (aside from the exceptions mentioned above).

Information about the Vaccination Certificate: - must be printed or electronically displayed; (vouchers that are exclusively in QR-CODE format will not be accepted); - they must contain the traveller's name, the vaccine manufacturer's or trade name, the batch number(s) of the dose(s) applied and the date(s) of the dose(s) application; - vaccines approved by ANVISA, by the World Health Organization (WHO) or by the authority of the country in which the traveller was immunized are valid; - the application of the single dose or the last dose of the primary vaccination scheme must have occurred at least 14 days before the date of departure. * The documents issued abroad must be presented in Portuguese, Spanish, or English.

COMPOSITION OF DELEGATION

Each delegation shall consists of:

- 1. Head of delegation mandatory;
- 2. Deputy Head of delegation optional
- 3. Student athlete(s) mandatory;
- 4. Team officials mandatory;
- 5. Field of Play Officials (referees/umpires/judges) optional;
- 6. Additional adults optional;

Head of the delegation

There is a mandatory amount of one (1) head of the delegation per registering delegation.

- The head of the delegation shall be the sole intermediary between the delegation and the Local Organising Committee, the ISF Technical Commission, and the ISF Delegate.
- He/she may not combine the function with any other official role (i.e., coach, referee, etc.).

Deputy Head of delegation

- The role of Deputy HoD is to assist the Head of Delegation.
- The presence of the Deputy HoD is not mandatory.
- max 1 Deputy Head of a delegation from 150 to 250 participants
- max 2 Deputy Heads of a delegation from 251 participants

Student-athletes

- All student-athletes must be enrolled as full-time students at a school in the country in which they represent. All student-athletes must be attending schools that provide general education and/or vocational education incorporating segments of general education.
- Only athletes, registered on the team's list handed in at the accreditation, are authorised to take part in this competition.
- The following are not eligible to participate:
 - Attendees of vocational schools who only attend a school as a complement to their vocational training and are not full-time students with a segment of general education.
 - Students enrolled at schools that provide sports training without any general education.

Team officials (Coaches and Other Team Officials)

Coaches

• The coach shall train/direct student-athletes in the competition.

Other Team Officials

- The function of other team officials can be Doctor, trainers, Physiotherapists, Statisticians, Team managers, etc.)
- The function of each other team officials must be specified during the registration process.

COMPOSITION OF DELEGATION

Field of play officials - FOPO (judges, referees, umpires)

Depending on the sport and on the number of athletes entered, the LOC requests the registering delegation to provide required number of FOPOs. Failure to provide the required number of Field of play officials (referees, judges, umpires) will lead to a fine of 900 EUR per referee payable to the organiser.

Additional adults

The function of each additional adult must be specified during the registration process (interpreter, security personnel, ministry representative, media, etc.).



Participants Obligations

Participation

This event is open to the participation of:

- 1.ISF members: Schools Sports Entities recognised as such by the ISF General Assembly and in order with their rights and obligations;
- 2. Non-ISF members: highest institution responsible for school sports recognized by the government of a country that is not a member of ISF;
- 3. Directly applying to schools (DAS): Directly applying to schools can either be:
- A school not affiliated with an ISF member;
- A school affiliated with an ISF member but not registering through this ISF member.

Each participant is required to be present throughout the whole duration of the event.

- Each participant is obliged to take part in all the non-sport activities.
- Each team undertakes to compete against all other participating teams.
- Each participant undertakes to compete against all other participants.
- The absence of any member of a participating team from any part of the entire sport, opening, prize-giving and closing ceremonies and socio-cultural programme may result in the team being excluded from the final results.

In archery, each delegation can enter a maximum number of 16 participants divided as follows:

- from 4 to 6 athletes = 2 coaches
- from 7 to 9 athletes = 3 coaches

Tournament specifics

- Individual events (recurve & compound / men & women): delegations can enter 1, 2 or 3 archers
- Recurve Boys Team Event = 3 boys from the same delegation
- Compound Boys Team Event = 3 boys from the same delegation
- Recurve Girls Team Event = 3 girls from the same delegation
- Compound Girls Team Event = 3 girls from the same delegation
- Recurve mixed team = 1 boy and 1 girl from the same delegation
- Compound mixed team = 1 boy and 1 girl from the same delegation

The following friendly events will be held within the archery competition days:
