TECHNICAL RULES AND REGULATIONS



2024



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GENERAL

The purpose of the “ISF Boxing Technical Rules and Regulations” is to provide standardized rules and regulations for all Boxing competitions. This document is set up in accordance with the ISF Statutes, the ISF Sport Policy, the ISF General Competition Regulations and the International Boxing Association (IBA) Rules.

This document is intended to ensure that all matters related to competitions are conducted in a fair and orderly manner. The specific objectives of this document are to:

1. Define and specify the **general conditions** under which participants can take part in the ISF Boxing events;
2. Determine the **delegation composition**;
3. Determine the **sport program**;
4. Determine the **technical rules**;
5. Set the **draw** procedure;
6. Set **protests and appeals** procedure.

Please note that the technical rules and regulations are applicable to ISF Boxing event in 2024.

1.GENERAL CONDITIONS

The competition will be run according to the ISF rules and regulations and IBF technical rules under the direction of the IFB. Any decisions over matters not mentioned in the present document will be taken by the ISF Boxing Technical Commission.

- The ISF Boxing events are open to individuals.
- The competition is categorized as: boy categories, girls categories.

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2. DELEGATION COMPOSITION

Each delegation will consist of:

- Head of delegation - mandatory
- Deputy Head of Delegation - optional
- Student athlete(s) - mandatory
- Team officials - mandatory
- Field of Play Officials (referees/umpires/judges) - mandatory
- Additional adults - optional
- Safeguarding officer - optional
- Young reporter - optional

HEAD OF DELEGATION (HOD)

- There is a mandatory amount of one (1) head of the delegation per registering delegation.
- The head of the delegation shall be the sole intermediary between the delegation and the Local Organising Committee, and the ISF.
- He/she may not combine the function with any other official role (i.e., coach, referee, etc.).

DEPUTY HEAD OF DELEGATION (Deputy HoD)

- The role of Deputy HoD is to assist the Head of Delegation.
- The presence of the Deputy HoD is not mandatory.
- max 1 Deputy Head of a delegation from 100 to 200 participants.
- max 2 Deputy Heads of a delegation from 201 or more participants.

ATHLETES

- All student-athletes must be enrolled as full-time students at a school in the country in which they represent.
- All student-athletes must be attending schools that provide general education and/or vocational education incorporating segments of general education.
- Only athletes, registered on the team's list handed in at the accreditation, are authorized to take part in this competition.
- The tournament will be organized in 2 age categories for each gender Class A (2008); Class B - (2006-2007).

The following are *not* eligible to participate:

- Attendees of vocational schools only attend a school as a complement to their vocational training and are not full-time students with a segment of general education.
- Students enrolled at schools that provide sports training without any general education.

TEAM OFFICIALS

COACHES

- The presence of a coach is mandatory.
- Teams or individuals cannot participate in the competition without the presence of a coach.
- Each delegation shall enter a minimum of one (1) coach per gender.



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OTHER TEAM OFFICIALS

- The function of other team officials can be: doctor, trainer, physiotherapist, statistician, team manager etc.
- The presence of the other team officials is not mandatory.
- The function of the other team officials must be specified during the registration process.
- Any person not specified during registration or exceeding the limit will not be considered part of the team.

FIELD OF PLAY OFFICIALS

- The field of play official (umpire) cannot combine their position with other positions, such as heads of delegation, team officials or additional adults.
- Umpires shall be in possession international or national (minimum) qualification depending on the event type. The Level of qualification shall be described in the events bulletins.
- The qualification will be reviewed and approved by the ISF Boxing technical commission.
- Delegations must provide certificates for umpires during the registration process.
- Failure to provide the required number of umpires will lead to a fine of 900€ (per umpire) payable to the organiser prior to the competitions.
- FOPO (referee&judge) must bear minimum IBA1.

Minimum number of FOPO (judges) per delegation:

- From 1 to 4 athletes = 0 FOPO (Judge)
- From 5 to 8 athletes = 1 FOPO (Referee & Judge) must be a minimum of IBA 1
- 9 or more athletes = 2 FOPOs (Referee & Judge) must be a minimum of IBA 1

ADDITIONAL ADULTS

- The function of additional adults can be: interpreter, security personnel, ministry representatives, media, etc.
- The presence of additional adults is not mandatory.
- The function of each additional adult must be specified during the registration process.
- Any other additional persons not specified during registration or exceeding the limit specified in this document will not be considered part of the official delegation and will not be accredited by the LOC.

SAFEGUARDING OFFICER

The role of the safeguarding officer is to provide support to the delegation in any situation related to safety.

Young reporter

Each delegation may bring additional young students who will take the role of a young reporter during the ISF event.



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3. SPORT PROGRAM

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4. TECHNICAL RULES

RULES

A Sports Entry Check is mandatory for all boxing competitions, all participating Delegations must attend the Sports Entry Check to confirm their registered Boxers and Team Officials. Delegations should attend the Sports Entry Check two days before the first competition day, this will be held in accordance with IBA Technical and Competition Rule 6.

The weight category and class of the Boxer will be determined by the confirmation of weight at the Sports Entry Check and shall not be changed once the Sports Entry Check has been completed.

The Weigh In will be organised for each morning with those scheduled to compete weighing in. The Weigh In and the medical control will be scheduled for 60 minutes. After having been examined by qualified physicians who are obliged to eliminate any boxer who presents any danger of contagious diseases, the boxer can be weighed in. No weight tolerance will be allowed at any stage.

Number of Rounds:

- Class A – Three (3) rounds of two (2) minutes, one (1) minute rest between rounds.
- Class B – Three (3) rounds of two (2) minutes, one (1) minute rest between rounds.

SYSTEM OF PLAY

IBA Scoring System - 10 Point Must – Electronic Scoring System will be used.

SPECIFIC RULES

(Class A) All Ten (10) oz gloves must be used for all weight categories.

(Class B) Girls – Ten (10) oz gloves must be worn for all weight categories.

Boys – Ten (10) oz gloves must be worn for 46-48kg category to the 63.5-67kg category.

Twelve (12) oz gloves must be worn for the 67-71kg category to the 92+kg category.

Medals will be distributed to the first four (4) boxers of each Category (1 Gold, 1 Silver, 2 Bronze)

If a category has only one total entrant then that Boxer will be awarded the Gold medal.

The Event will be officiated by IBA 1, 2 or 3 Star (or equivalent) Referees and Judges where possible.

Weigh In for all categories will be completed with Boxers wearing a minimum of shorts and vest.



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ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

All Boxers must bring with them:

- Record book with annual medicals must be duly completed and updated
- Personal protective equipment;
 - o Gumshield
 - o Hand wraps – Velcro bandages (IBA Licensees)
 - o Groin protection – Boy boxers MUST wear cup protector and may, additionally, wear a jock-strap.
 - o Breast protection – Girl boxers may wear a breast protector and may, additionally, wear a cup protector.
- Uniform - Each boxer must bring uniforms according the IBA boxing attire regulations. The colours of the uniform must be in accordance with IBA Technical and Competition Rules.

5. DRAW

- The ISF Boxing Technical Commission is responsible for establishing the schedule and setting the timing of the Draw.
- It is mandatory for a team representative (Head Coach or HoD) to attend the Official Draw.
- The Competition Technical Delegate is responsible for the Official Draw and determining the competition schedule in liaison with the ISF Boxing Technical Commission.

6. PROTESTS AND APPEALS

- There will be no protests or appeals during ISF Boxing competitions.
- Any Boxer who is deemed by the ISF Boxing Technical Commission and the Technical Delegate to have breached the ISF Fair Play rules could be removed from the competition and/or stripped of any medal position.

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
